Height served on the National Council of Negro Women for 40 years, fought for gender and racial equality throughout her lifetime, and played a significant role in the civil rights movement. As a civil rights and women's rights activist, she specifically focused on the issues of African-American women, including unemployment, illiteracy, and voter awareness. She was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom in 1994 and the Congressional Gold Medal in 2004, the highest civilian awards in the United States.

Height is the author of two books: Swing Wide the Freedom Gates: A Memoir and Living with Purpose: An Activist's Guide to Listening. Learning and Leading.

Advocate and Take Action on AAUW Public Policy Issues

The 2016 election is over. While the new administration and 115th Congress have the potential to raise serious challenges to AAUW priority issues, there may also be some strategic opportunities to advance the mission. Each of us can take the next steps to make sure that women, girls, and their families are a priority for this country. Democracy demands work every day of the year, and our AAUW community will step up to the challenge!

The first request for action is to encourage support of the Pay Equity for All Act of 2016

(H.R. 6030). The Pay Equity for All Act would protect job seekers from having to disclose their salary history in order to be interviewed, to be considered for a job offer, or as a condition of employment, and from being retaliated against for refusing to disclose their prior salary.

Many employers base salary offers on a candidate's previous pay – which, because of the pay gap, is often lower for women than for men. Simply eliminating the reliance on salary history in setting future wages would go a long way toward closing the pay gap. Pay discrimination starts early in women's careers, and relying on prior salary as a marker for future pay only compounds the problem. By banning the use of this practice, all workers will have the opportunity to take home a fairer paycheck based on the work they're doing today rather than jobs they've held in the past.

Please consider calling Representative Nolan's at 218-454-4018 (Brainerd office) or 202-225-6211 (DC Office) to urge him to take action to combat the gender pay gap by co-sponsoring the Pay Equity for All Act of 2016 (H.R. 6030).
