May 23 - Culture of Poverty

BOOK SALE—Before and After the Meeting

Cathy Rucci will talk about the Culture of Poverty at AAUW's meeting on May 23. She will bring both a personal perspective as well as academic background to provide a greater understanding of what it means to be poor in Minnesota.

Cathy is the Executive Director of MORE, an organization in St. Paul serving refugees and immigrants. She has worked in the local nonprofit community for more than twenty years. During the early 1990s, Cathy developed a deep commitment to making a difference while she served in a National Volunteer Service Program, VISTA, in Austin, Texas. This experience intensified her drive to impact the world by providing leadership to a strong, healthy, human services-oriented nonprofit organization. For ten years, she worked in the hunger-relief field managing programs in both local and statewide capacities.

In 2011, she received a Certificate in Nonprofit Management from the Humphrey School of Public Affairs at the University of Minnesota. The following year, she completed a Master's of Liberal Studies at the U of MN in which she analyzed the practice of Nonprofit Management through the disciplines/lenses of Business, Public Affairs and Social Work. As the Executive Director at MORE for the past five years, Cathy practices a leadership style that maintains a healthy balance between the people-centered values of Social Work and the business-minded practices of Management.
