short stories. At age 16, she was awarded a prize from the *Boston Herald* for "An Early Morning Paddle", a story about a boy who watches a sunrise from a canoe. After high school, she attended Wellesley College and graduated with a B.A. in English in 1902.

During Douglas' adult life, she was known as an American journalist, author, women's suffrage advocate, and conservationist, best known for her dedication to the preservation of the Everglades. After an unhappy marriage to a "con man", she moved to Miami to work for *The Miami Herald* where her father was publisher. She became a freelance writer, writing short stories and books, with the best known being *The Everglades: River of Grass*. After a time working in Paris for the American Red Cross during the war, she returned to Miami and became an assistant editor at *The Miami Herald*.

Marjory was outspoken and politically active in the women's suffrage and civil rights movements. In 1917, she traveled with Mary Baird Bryan (wife of William Jennings Bryan) to Tallahassee to speak in support of women's right to vote. It wasn't until she was 79 years old that she took a central role in the protection of the

For her efforts, she was honored by having an elementary and a high school with her name, a park, and the Florida Department of Environmental Protection building in Tallahassee. In 1993, Ms. Douglas was awarded the Presidential Medal of Freedom at age 103. Ironically, while she was in the White House that day, she witnessed the signing of the Brady Bill.

Marjory Stoneman Douglas died at age 108 on May 14, 1998. Her ashes were scattered over 1,300,000 acres of the Marjory Stoneman Douglas Wilderness Area in Everglades National Park.

AAUW National Bylaws Amendments

AAUW members recently received an email from national noting 3 proposed amendments to the AAUW Bylaws. The proposed amendments address:

- Creating three-year staggered board terms
- Opening board service to those outside the AAUW membership
- Eliminating the degree requirement for membership

Rationale provided by the AAUW Board for the proposed amendments: The first two proposals would bring AAUW's board governance structure more in line with nationally accepted nonprofit best practices and the needs of the organization. The third proposal - to eliminate the degree requirement for membership - has come before the membership for vote a number of times. The board feels strongly that while the requirement made sense at AAUW's inception, this requirement is now perceived by many counter to the AAUW mission and limits our ability to build our capacity needed to increase AAUW's impact.

The Ely Branch will also discuss as part of the annual meeting in April. No doubt, this will also be a topic of discussion at the upcoming AAUW MN State Convention.

Voting will open on April 25, 2018 and close June 9, 2018, at 9 p.m. ET. Since AAUW has "One member, One vote", all members will receive an email with instructions to vote online or instructions on how to request a paper ballot.
