All AAUW members are encouraged to attend the state convention April 29-30, 2022, hosted by the Saint Cloud Area Branch. The cost is \$135 and includes Friday appetizers and banquet, Saturday morning coffee break, luncheon, speakers, seminars, business meeting, historic presentation, and music. AAUW CEO Gloria Blackwell will be speaking virtually to the convention on Friday night, and Saturday's keynote speaker will be Dr Joy Plamann, President of the St Cloud Hospital. Hastings Branch has funds to offset some of the costs associated with attending the convention. There is a registration form at the end of the TWIG.

Conversation About Title IX

Fifty years ago, congress passed legislation that is known today as “Title IX”. This groundbreaking education law declared that no one, based on their gender, could be discriminated against or denied participation in any education program or activity that received federal financial assistance.

The Title IX passage dramatically changed women’s opportunities for involvement in all areas of education including recruitment, admissions and housing; career and technical education; pregnant, parenting, and/or married students; science, technology, engineering and math (STEM); sexual harassment and assault; comparable facilities and access to course offerings; financial assistance; student health services and insurance benefits; harassment based on gender identity; and athletics. Many of these areas had traditionally been open only to men at the high school and college levels.

But, 50 years later how are we doing? Are women being treated equitably? Do they receive the attention, opportunities and promotions as their male counterparts? To give us perspective, at our March meeting we will hear from Hastings Public school district Title IX Coordinator Cathy Moen and Interim HHS principal Scott Doran on challenges faced by the district, the role and training of the Title IX coordinator and how the district achieves its Title IX goals.

1. President Lisa Hedin called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm. Given our branch calendar for the rest of the year, she noted February is a month to breathe. March: nominations of board members for the next term; April: our spring meeting and social, as well as approval of 2022-23 budget and input by members for next year's programs.

The minutes of the January meeting were approved as published in the TWIG. Motion: Mary Ellen Fox; Second: Kathy O'Keefe.

2. Treasurer's Report: Carol Tobin reported a current balance of \$4,969.02, noting several donations made in honor of Pat Giddings, as well as an award from AAUW Minnesota for the cost of our annual Zoom subscription fee.

3. Committee Reports

a. **Membership:** Kathy Palmer reported on one new member, increasing the total number of branch members to 91.

b. **Program:** Mary Ellen Fox reminded members of the March program on the subject of Title IX, with speakers from Hastings High School. The Feminist Club has been invited to attend.

c. **Public Policy:** Pat Powers mentioned two emails she received lately, which Linda Bindman will circulate to members for their information and possible activism: the first relating to the ERA, and the second to the many bills proposed in the MN State legislature on election procedures that may affect voting rights of Minnesotans. Pat highly recommended that members read sports journalist Pat Reusse's recent Star Tribune article on Title IX.

d. **NCCWSL:** Pat Powers had several printed applications for scholarships being sponsored by the Hastings branch for the virtual NCCWSL conference of May 24-26. Any member who knows of any eligible college women were encouraged to take and distribute.

e. **Book Club:** Shirley Tammen encouraged all members interested in discussing Kristen Hannah's *Four Winds* to attend the next meeting on Monday, March 14, 1:30 pm, at the Hastings Library.

f. **AAUW Funds/HHS Scholarship:** Glenda Schnirring reported that the Hastings branch's donation of \$1000 to AAUW National objectives of "Greatest Need", plus \$2,500 in individual donations from Hastings AAUW members brought the year's total branch support to National to \$3,500. In addition to Lew Linde and Sally Jepsen, Fran Schoen and Pat Giddings will be honored with an AAUW National certificate.

Glenda said that the selection of Hastings AAUW annual HHS Scholarship award winner is complete and will be announced in May. A committee of four members (Marjorie Peterson, Marilyn Tennesen, Kathy Stockman and Glenda) met recently to select the winning student and an alternate.

g. **Gad-Abouts:** Cindy Topping announced she had one ticket left for the planned outing to the Sheldon Theater on Friday, April 8, 1:30 pm. The first member to come to her with a check will join the group.

h. **Community:** Margaret Goderstad recommended the Hastings Art Center's upcoming Coffee Concerts, on Tuesday, March 1, 10:30 am, and Tuesday, March 29, 10:30 am, as well as the current art show on display, "An Affair of the Heart."

She reminded of the River Valley Band Children's Concert on Sunday, March 6, 3 pm at the Hastings Middle School Auditorium.

i. **Diversity:** Peggy Horsch reported on a grant proposal she will submit to Minnesota State AAUW to support the cost of a program next year on gender disparities in Minnesota's economy and in other areas.
