AAUW MN: President's Final Message to Branches

My parting message as AAUW MN president is featured in the Summer Edition of THE PINE. You may read the entire message there. Branch presidents received a separate mailing with detailed information to message to branch leaders. I strongly encourage and request that branch presidents share the information with branch members. I even color-coded the information to correspond with a branch designee/committee chair with hope that will be a helpful way to share the information.

I also included a review of the AAUW MN Strategic Plan and the areas we completed actions and implementations. We've done well in many areas. But there is still work to be done.

Here, in an abbreviated version, are key points to carry forward to branch members.

1. Membership: Members of the AAUW National Advancement Committee have asked national staff for a response & reaction to the Open UP AAUW membership vote result. Affiliates need assistance as we maneuver the after effects. Those after effects have begun. Members, who are leaving AAUW as a result of the failure of the vote, is very unexpected. Thus, state leaders are seeking, from national, an action response and a strong, inciteful membership campaign.

2. Leadership recruitment: The Advancement Committee and National staff are developing a workbook to feature creative methods to recruit and fill leadership vacancies. The document will be shared upon completion.

3. Partnerships/Collaborations: Partnerships & collaborations are the responsibility of affiliates. Please find like-minded organizations to cooperate with and demonstrate the value of AAUW.

4. Communications: Communications issues are prevalent everywhere. AAUW MN provides every tool to communicate through the website, FB page, THE PINE, email postings, postcards, newspapers and phone calls. But we can't make members read, open email or the website or follow on FB. Please try to be cognizant to all the tools being used to keep members informed.

5. Public Policy Priorities: Promotion of public policy priorities at the branch level is going to be critical as we move closer to November 5, 2024. I can only say 'women must prevail'. Convince every person, every gender, every ethnicity of the importance of their vote in national and state elections. Our lives literally depend on it.

My term of office ends June 30, 2024. It has been my pleasure to have served as your AAUW MN state president. I look forward to new responsibilities with AAUW MN. And, I will continue service on two National Committees — Diversity/Equity/Inclusion and Advancement.

Thank you, each and every one of you, for all you do to support AAUW and promote the mission of AAUW to the best of your ability.
