NATIONAL NEWS

AAUW National is making a concerted effort to inform members of its objectives in the key areas of Public Policy, Membership, Diversity/Equity/Inclusion, C/U members partnerships and the Five-Star Program. All, is to be achieved this year through better engagement with members to the broad objectives of the organization, while sustaining the mission of Equity for Women and Girls.

Each key area is defined fully on the AAUW National website. Updates from AAUW National publication *Membership Matters* are provided here in this newsletter. Branches should use the information to build strong branch advocacy and programming.

PUBLIC POLICY: Staying Nonpartisan and State Events

As a nonpartisan organization, any activities or statements conducted under AAUW's name must not show support or opposition to a partisan candidate or political party. This election season, make sure to follow <u>our guidelines for election activities</u>. Public Policy officers hosted a webinar on September 4, at 3:30 p.m. ET that provided an in-depth discussion of how to stay on the right side of the rules when engaging in the election. Voter Engagement: Town Halls and Watch Parties. The AAUW National *It's My Vote!* campaign to educate people about issues we care about is just heating up. Branch Public Policy chairs have been provided information and may share it with members.

On August 31, AAUW collaborated on a <u>Celebration of Reading</u> in Washington, DC to stand up against censorship groups like Moms for Liberty.

AAUW also proudly partnered with the **YWomen Vote Gen Z Townhall**. It was a great opportunity to hear directly from Gen Z voters about their views on education equity, voting rights, and more.

During the September 10 Presidential debate AAUW provided links to Watch parties & provided wa-Bingo cards for some humor.

September 17 was National Voter Registration Day. AAUW National has provided It's My Vote! stickers for any branch that organized an voter registration event. This was the perfect opportunity to learn about the Electoral College - its origins, history, problems & possible solutions.

AAUW National held a special Membership Gathering on September 10, at 4 p.m. ET. AAUW National recognized our outstanding supporters and branches and shared updates on work in Policy, Programs, Membership, and more. A recording will be on the AAUW National website.

AAUW National Membership Dues Rates

April 1 kicked off the 2025 Fiscal Year (FY25) membership dues collection process for AAUW branches. FY25 National dues remain the same: Annual National (\$72), Students (\$18.81), and Lifetime (\$1,440). As of January 2024, all National dues are **FULLY** tax deductible!

College/University Members Partnerships

College/University Membership dues are \$250 and include two free national memberships for their named representatives and free national student memberships. The newly designed <u>CU</u> <u>Member Toolkit</u> helps branches promote and engage with prospective and current campuses in your community. In addition to FAQs for members National has included a CU Membership Flyer, how to join/renew student members for free, as well as flyers to encourage students, staff and faculty on campus to access our Salary Negotiation and Financial Literacy training available to all CU Members. Registration is now open for Women's Economic Empowerment Initiative (WEEI) webinars and the schedule is listed on <u>this page</u>.

Diversity/Equity/Inclusion are integrated into Membership. Despite the outcome of the National Membership by-laws vote, National continues to emphasize the need to move forward as an inclusive and diverse organization for the purpose of achieving equity. Branches should asked: what does equity mean in your community? What did it mean in the past? What does your branch do to meet equity? The National DEI Committee is developing webinars to address issues and perceptions. Watch for upcoming announcements.



FIVE-STAR PROGRAM:

Five Star Resources and FY25

As fall begins, many branches are gearing up for their fall programs. The updated FY25 Five Star Program Criteria, covering branch activities from July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025, serve as a framework for branch success. Every branch has the opportunity to earn a star in one or more categories.

National encourages all branches to participate in the Annual Branch Survey so they can learn more about the impact members are making in local communities and how National Ican better support branches and members. The survey will be emailed to branch presidents on **September 12**.

The <u>Five Star Program Page</u> has been updated to show the criteria required to achieve stars this year. Additionally, the <u>Five Star Program page</u> now includes a Frequently Asked Questions section to address common inquiries. National will continue to update these resources throughout the year based on leader feedback.

Community Hub Tips and Highlights

To improve the ways members use and interact with the Community Hub, National highlights some frequently raised items or questions that can benefit all members.

Add/Join Members - To add/join a new, lapsed, or transfer members, follow these quick steps when managing your roster.

- 1. **Actions > Add Individual** which puts an individual on the roster.
- o This action triggers a notification that is sent to the President/Administrator, Membership VP and Finance Officer which informs that an individual has been added to the roster. **NEW!** Please note that the language in this notification has been updated and the Subject has been changed from 'New Member Notification' to 'A New Individual Has Been Added to the Branch Roster'.
- 2. Then you must click **Join Individuals** to process their payment.
- o *Hint:* You can tell that a payment hasn't been processed for a new member if the **Member_Type** column on the exported roster is blank.

Renewal Reminders and Reimbursements!

Both College/University and Branch Members for those branches that opted to have National send renewal emails for self-renewal, will be sent each month during the week of the 20th! Members without email addresses will require outreach from the branch.

When members self-pay online, their dues generally include national, state, and local. Finance officers receive a copy of the member's confirmation (receipt) to help in knowing who has paid and what dues were included in the payment.

AAUW reconciles the dues receipts monthly, then deposits them via ACH to your branch bank account at the end of the **following month**. A separate disbursement report follows that includes member names and payment details to match your deposit.

Don't Lose Your Affiliate Tax-Exempt Status with the IRS

All AAUW-affiliates must file a tax return each year. The simplest option for non-profits is Form 990-N, which AAUW can prepare if your annual gross receipts are \$50k or less.

To have AAUW file your 990-N, complete the group exemption form by October 15 in the Community Hub. Go to MY AFFILIATIONS, then click the button next to your affiliate name. Choose TAX INFORMATION, then click the button at the top that reads: CLICK TO REQUEST 990N 07/01/2023-06/30/2024. The principal officer is the finance officer. Verify that your (EIN) is correct, so your filing isn't rejected. If you do not qualify to file Form 990-N, AAUW cannot file your return. Filings/confirmations will be processed in the order in which they are received, so please bear with us as we file for each affiliate!
