The Austin Branch of AAUW is looking forward to welcoming you to our town on April 25th and 26th for the AAUW Minnesota Annual Meeting. We have a busy two days planned for you.

The main hotel is the Double Tree by Hilton. We will have members in the lobby starting at noon to provide information. Registration packets will be available at the Austin Country Club beginning at 4:30 and again on Saturday morning at the Hormel Institute.

On Friday afternoon, self-paced tours are available at the Spam Museum (corner of 101 3rd Ave NE and Main St.) and Hormel Historic Home (208 4th Ave NW) (the former home of George A. Hormel). Sweet Reads Bookstore – across from the Spam Museum and owned by one of our members – is also looking forward to welcoming you.

We will have members of our branch in all three locations as resources. If you choose to have dessert and coffee/lemonade at the Hormel Home, there is a \$5.00 charge. You can pay for it when you register. When you arrive, we will have a list at the site, so no ticket is necessary.

The official conference begins at 5:00 p.m. on Friday at the Austin Country Club. There will be a cash bar and time to socialize. Dinner will be served at 6:00 p.m. The highlight of Friday evening will be a presentation by one of our members, who will portray Gertrude Ellis Skinner, who is officially recognized as a pillar of Austin and was a woman ahead of her time. We will hear in her own words about some of her adventures on her worldwide travels in the late 1800s.

On Saturday, check-in for Silent Auction items and breakfast will begin at 7:30 at the Hormel Institute, a world-renowned cancer research facility. The day will include the official annual business meeting; Mary Cathryn Ricker, Executive Director of the Albert Shanker Institute, will be the keynote speaker. There will be time for bidding on the Silent Auction and networking with State Board members on specific topics and members from other branches. After lunch, we will hear from a Hormel Institute scientist and tour the multi-million-dollar Hormel Institute, a branch of the University of Minnesota's cancer research division.

# **AAUW NATIONAL NEWS**



What's happening: As a valued member leader of AAUW, I wanted to let you know that the AAUW Board approved a modest dues adjustment — \$2 per year over the next two years.

New national dues: \$74 starting April 1, 2025, and \$76 starting April 1, 2026.

Why it matters: Member dues are an important funding source for AAUW. While costs for member support increase annually, dues have not kept pace. During the feedback process, we heard from more than 750 members. The Board's decision to increase dues by \$2 reflects an adjustment to the original proposal to lessen the burden of a dues increase on members while keeping pace with inflation.

Your member dues help fund member services such as:

- Administrative Support: Assist with dues processing, Community Hub management, 990N filings, branding materials, and toolkits (e.g., DEI Toolkit, College/University Member Toolkit).
- Website Support: Update and manage ~500 branch and state websites and provide ongoing Site Resources support.
- Member Trainings: Hold regular virtual member gatherings and training programs.
- Member Engagement: Organize member-led groups and committees like Archives Corps, Lobby Corps, and national committees.
- Speaker Engagement: Offer National speakers for branch meetings and state conventions.
- Real-Time Support: Connect Team provides daily assistance and semiweekly "Office Hours" for member leaders.

And more!

The bottom line: We heard you. The dues increase balances AAUW's financial sustainability with the member feedback we received.
