I have only good news to report!

Membership renewals have been coming in fast. Only 11 members remain who have not renewed or informed me that they are moving away or will not be rejoining. This is ahead of last year at this time. Sally Hagman was the winner of the free membership at the May meeting. She had just given me her check and I handed it back to her an hour later.

Our scholarship fundraising was very successful. We added one additional scholarship at GRACF in May because we could see that your generosity would allow it. Along with the \$2070 raised with direct checks to the fund, Travel Treasures, Book Sales, Anita's scarf sale, and Honorariums helped us reach a total of \$3398. This is enough to support 2 of the \$1500 scholarships without having to count on growth from our endowment at the Grand Rapids Area Community Foundation. With the uncertainty of the stock market at this time I hope we can count on you again next year.

Marva Jean Hutchens paid for the scholarship recipients at the May dinner. She has done this for the past several years and it is greatly appreciated.
