Secretary's report: Karen Karls moved the minutes from the previous board meeting be approved as read. Janis Johnson seconded the motion. Minutes were approved.

Treasurer's report:

- We currently have 77 members.
- Fall Northland Gathering: 29 members attended from our chapter. 23 attended from other chapters. Our total expenses were \$1585.25. We have \$338.75 left over.
- GRACF has received the \$4000 for the Lonson scholarship in 2026.
- We are a bit behind receiving member donations for the other scholarships.
 Hopefully we will receive a number of donations at the December holiday meeting.
- The budget for the summer picnic was \$110 and we spent \$44.33.
- The bank balance as of November 7, 2025 is \$6378 with \$5538 available to spend. \$840 is reserved for scholarships.
